

Central Park Recreational Access Permits Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What types of permits are available?

There are two type of annual permits and one day pass permit for property access. A permit is required for **ALL** access including hunting, fishing, hiking, walking, and bicycling.

Annual Motorized Permit (MP) -- Annual permit that covers individual and family Companion use. **(\$325.00)** Permits are valid March 1 – February 28. Limited number of permits **(25)** available. This Permit allows access for **Licensee and one (1) designated adult Companion who is either a parent, spouse, domestic partner or adult child of Permittee , and accompanying minor children under 18 years of age.** Designated Adult Companion entering the property must also have a copy of permit, available through invitation following permit purchases. Minors are not listed on permit and must be accompanied by a Licensee (i.e., parent, guardian).

Annual Non-Motorized Permit (NMA) – Annual Permit that covers one adult individual and accompanying minor children under age of 18 years for Non-Motorized use. **(\$80.00)** Permits are valid March 1 – February 28. Unlimited number of permits available.

Day Pass Non-Motorized Permit (NMD) – Day pass that covers one adult individual and accompanying minor children under age of 18 years for Non-Motorized use. **(\$15.00)** Permits are valid for daylight hours of the day specified during purchase. Unlimited number of permits available.

Can I access the Central Park property without a permit in certain times of year?

No. A permit is required at all times for all access including hunting, fishing, hiking, walking, and bicycling.

When, where, how can I buy a permit?

To check for updates, start at <https://cgrecreationpermit.com>. To open or create account, follow the links to (MOA) My Outdoor Agent <https://myoutdooragent.com> and search for **CG –Central Park Property** permits. Website charges for permit purchase will appear as “**One Connect**” powered by Orbis.

What if Motorized Permits sell out before I purchase mine?

Permits are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional motorized permits will **not** be sold.

What can I expect when I buy a permit online?

Permit allows access to the Central Park property. After website purchase the permit will be in your My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account (<https://myoutdooragent.com>). You must download from the **License Agreement Tab** in your MOA account to **PRINT your copy of permit (with QR code)** and have it in your possession while recreating on the property. Be prepared to show your permit and photo ID when asked by law enforcement, security, or Campbell Global personnel. Permit is for the personal use of an individual, single family and is non-transferable. Single family means permit holder and his/her immediate family Companions (defined above). Adult Companion must also carry **their own permit** copy.

MOTORIZED: We will mail you a key, windshield sticker(s) for your vehicle(s), etc. within 3 weeks of purchase. If you do not receive your packet within three (3) weeks of purchase, please contact Campbell Global at kelso.recreation@campbellglobal.com. You have Six (6) weeks from date of purchase to notify

Campbell Global regarding refunds or permit delivery. **No refunds or replacements will occur past 45 days from purchase.** Adult Companion will need to carry a copy of permit issued from their MOA account. Failure to have windshield sticker on registered vehicle is immediate revocation of permit.

How do I add a second vehicle to my Motorized Permit?

A second vehicle can be added to your permit through your MOA account. 1) The preferred way is to add your second vehicle in MOA account at the time of purchase or 2) add second vehicle in MOA account immediately after permit purchase. You must notify us via email at kelso.recreation@campbellglobal.com of any vehicle changes and **include your motorized permit number**. Be prepared to provide proof of purchase or ownership. Permanent plates are required to enter vehicle in MOA account for a second sticker.

What if I sell my vehicle or get my windshield replaced?

If you sell a vehicle or get a windshield replaced, you must remove active permit sticker. Stickers must be retained and are non-transferrable. You may request a new sticker by email at kelso.recreation@campbellglobal.com. **Include your motorized permit number** and be prepared to provide evidence of original sticker to get replacement sticker. Be prepared to provide proof of windshield purchase or vehicle ownership.

How do I add a Companion when I buy a permit online?

For adult Companion (defined above) to recreate on the property, they **MUST** be added in primary MOA account as a “member”. To complete the process, the Companion will need to create their **OWN account**, accept the membership AND print and carry their own copy of the permit (with QR code) while recreating. Minor children are not listed on permit, but must be accompanied by a permitted parent.

How does the family permit work?

Annual Motorized Permits are issued for the permit holder and eligible family members only. This includes one (1) designated adult companion who is a parent, spouse, domestic partner, or adult child of the permit holder, along with accompanying minor children under age 18. Children who are age 17 at the time of permit purchase but turn 18 during the permit year may remain covered under the parent’s permit. Minor children are not listed on the permit and must be accompanied by a permitted adult.

Can I bring a friend?

Access rules depend on your permit type.

Annual Motorized Permit

You may bring:

- **One (1) designated adult family companion** (parent, spouse, domestic partner, or adult child), and
- Any accompanying minor children (under age 18) for whom you or your designated companion is the parent or legal guardian.

No other adult guests or friends are permitted under this permit.

Annual Non-Motorized Permit

This permit allows access only for:

- The permit holder, and
- Their accompanying minor children (under age 18).

No additional adult companions or guests are permitted.

Day Pass (Non-Motorized)

A Day Pass allows access only for:

- The individual named on the Day Pass, and
- Their accompanying minor children (under age 18).

A Day Pass does not allow vehicle use and does not extend access to additional guests.

Important

Permits are **non-transferable**.

Allowing unauthorized individuals onto the property may result in **revocation of your permit**.

How do I get to the property?

Property is along north side of State Hwy 12 between Aberdeen and Montesano and is accessed off of Hwy 12 and off of Geissler Road. See Property Map.

What about fire season?

The weather is impossible to predict, but we have days or weeks of ‘fire weather’ or weather where the fuel moisture is low. We have a responsibility to protect the property, so there may be times during the summer and/or fall when the property is completely closed.

Can I ride my E-Bike, dirt bike, ATVs or snowmobile?

No. Motorcycles, ATVs, UTVs or snowmobiles cannot be on the property, even if they are street legal. Furthermore, they cannot be brought on property in the back of a pick-up or on a trailer. **No battery powered or battery assisted peddle vehicles are allowed.**

Can I ride my horse or mule?

Yes, if you have a valid motorized or a non-motorized permit. Each adult 18 years of age and older must have a permit and any minor must be accompanied by a parent or guardian that has a valid permit..

Cutting firewood?

MOTORIZED: Firewood may be cut with a motorized access permit when wood is available. Only down material from designated areas may be cut. **NO** standing trees may be cut.

Can I hunt, fish or trap?

Yes. All state laws must be obeyed regarding seasons, licenses, tags, and other regulations.

Can I target shoot?

No. Firearms are to be used for hunting during state-set hunting seasons only.

Can I build a campfire or cook over a barbeque?

No.

Can I cut a Christmas tree?

No live trees may be cut for any purpose.

Can I pick berries and mushrooms?

You may pick berries and mushrooms in reasonable quantities for personal use only. You may not sell any forest product gathered on the property.

Is there special access for handicapped hunters?

Handicapped hunters are welcome to hunt during state hunting seasons with a recreation access permit. If the handicapped hunter requires assistance to accompany them, the hunter and the individual assisting must make an appointment with Campbell Global office. The hunter must bring a copy of his or her Washington State disabled hunting license, placard along with the individual accompanying him or her. A waiver must be signed in person to be on the property. To make an appointment, email us at kelso.recreation@campbellglobal.com.

Can I purchase maps separately?

Maps are not available for purchase separately but may be downloaded for your PC or mobile device from your My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account.

What if I lose my key or permit?

Lost or stolen keys can be replaced for a fee of \$250. Permits may be reprinted from your My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account.

Can we host an organized event on the property? (i.e.: horseback riding event, cross-country run, mountain bike event, etc.)

No. Permits are for personal use only.

Can I use my recreation access permit to do research?

No. Permits are for personal recreational use only.

What do I do with my key at the end of the season?

Keys are not reused; they are yours to keep at the end of season.

What happens if I break the rules?

In order to maintain the privilege of using private property for recreational access, all permit conditions must be followed and are strictly enforced. If you or your companion(s) are caught breaking the rules, your permit will be revoked for the remainder of the season and may impact eligibility for future permits.
