

Campbell Global LLC (Campbell Global) Snoqualmie Tree Farm Recreation Access Rules and Regulations

Please read each section of the rules: General, Motorized Permit and Non-Motorized Permit.

General:

1. Annual Permit dates begin April 1 and extend through March 30 of following year. Access is allowed any day of the week from one and one half hour before sunrise to one and one half hour after sunset. No access is allowed on July 3rd, 4th or 5th. **The property owners reserve the right to limit or prohibit access to any portion of the property due to safety, fire hazard, extreme weather or other asset protection reason.** Access areas may be added or deleted by posting signs as the only notification to permit holders.
2. Permit holder may not or permit others to: (i) Use or possess alcohol, marijuana, or illegal drugs while on the property; or (ii) enter or remain on the property while under the influence of alcohol, marijuana, or illegal drugs. In addition to above, RCW 46.61.519 and RCW 46.61.005 apply while on property.
3. No fires, open flame, fireworks or any other items or activities that may cause fires including BBQs. Smoking is not allowed.
4. **No Camping**
5. No littering or dumping of garbage.
6. Berries, mushrooms and other forest products may be picked for personal use. No Christmas tree cutting.
7. Paragliding or any such apparatus is prohibited.
8. Flying of unmanned aircraft systems (drones) is strictly prohibited.
9. No target shooting. Firearms may be used for hunting during hunting seasons authorized by Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) only.
10. Hunting, fishing and trapping must follow all bag limits and regulations established by the WDFW. Property managed by Campbell Global is not considered "open and unclaimed" for the purposes of treaty hunting.
11. Dogs and other animals must be under owner's control. No hounds are allowed on property during any deer or elk season.
12. Tree stands and game cameras are allowed if they are temporary, so that nothing is driven, screwed or nailed into the tree causing damage to the tree.
13. When game is harvested, game harvest cards must be filled out online and emailed to sqrecreation@campbellglobal.com or left at kiosk before leaving property. Copies can be found on My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account (<https://myoutdooragent.com>).
14. Permit holder must report any accident that occurs while on property to Campbell Global within 24 hours of occurrence (sqrecreation@campbellglobal.com).
15. Permit holder must abide by all signs posted on the property and the instructions of any Campbell Global employee or representative.
16. Permit holder must abide by all modifications to these rules and regulations.
17. VIOLATION OF THESE RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL, AT THE DISCRETION OF CAMPBELL GLOBAL, RESULT IN THE REVOCATION OF THE PERMIT. ALL SALES ARE FINAL; REFUNDS WILL NOT BE GIVEN FOR ANY REASON.

Motorized Permit:

You have 45 DAYS FROM PURCHASE DATE to notify Campbell Global at sgrecreation@campbellglobal.com if you did not receive your packet. No refunds or replacements will occur past 45 days.

1. Permit is for the personal use of a single family and is non-transferable. Single family means permit holder and his/her immediate family (i.e., a legally recognized spouse and children **under age 18**). **IF PERMIT HOLDER ALLOWS ANY OTHER PERSON TO ENTER THE PROPERTY, THEN THIS PERMIT SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY REVOKED.** Permit is strictly for recreation access. No research or commercial activities are allowed.
2. Any person accessing the property for recreational purposes must have a Recreation Access Permit. The permit must be in the possession of the permit holder. Spouse must also carry their own permit copy from My Outdoor Agent (MOA) account (<https://myoutdooragent.com>).
3. Permit holders **must** fill out a sign-in card and leave at Kiosk when entering the property.
4. Windshield sticker must be attached to the lower left corner (driver side) on the outside of the windshield of vehicle. **Second sticker can be ordered upon purchase OR by adding vehicle on MOA account.** Vehicle changes on MOA need to be sent to sgrecreation@campbellglobal.com. **FAILURE TO HAVE STICKER ON REGISTERED VEHICLE IS IMMEDIATE REVOCATION OF PERMIT.**
5. One key will be issued with each permit. Gate key will not be replaced for any reason. Gate key allows access through Gates 10 and 11 (LAT 47 34 28.61; LONG -121 44 09.52) located on the east and west sides of the North Fork County Road, North Bend, WA. Google Pin is "Spur 10 gate road, Snoqualmie, WA." Motorized permit holders accessing the property via other gates will result in loss of permit.
6. Permit holder is responsible for opening, closing, and locking the gate upon entering and exiting the property.
7. Permit holder may not allow non-motorized access permit holders to ride in vehicle for any purpose. Giving a ride to non-motorized permit holder will result in loss of permit.
8. No parking overnight.
9. **Drive safely at all times with vehicle headlights on** and with the driver and all passengers seated within the passenger compartment of the vehicle with seatbelts securely fastened at all times. Vehicles must stay to the right side of the road and be able to stop within half the sight distance. The maximum speed limit is 30 miles per hour unless otherwise posted. Forest management traffic such as log trucks, rock trucks, service trucks and crew vehicles have right-of-way. Vehicles may not block or impede traffic at gates or on roadways.
10. Up to 5 cords of firewood may be cut annually from April 1 to May 31 and from October 16 to March 30 for personal use only. Firewood must be cut from designated areas and removed in firewood lengths. A firewood tag must be firmly attached to the load of firewood, one tag for every ¼ cord of firewood on the load. A cord of firewood measures 4' x 4' x 8' and equals 128 ft³, ¼ cord equals 4' x 4' x 2' or 32 ft³. The month and day must be fully punched out of each tag that is affixed to load. Tags may not be re-used, sold or reproduced. Firewood may not be gathered outside the regular firewood season or from outside designated areas. Winching wood out of units, use of firewood splitters or commercial size vehicles are prohibited. Cutting snags, buckskin logs, old growth and cedar is prohibited. Protect planted seedlings in areas where cutting. Maps are available on the website and at the gate kiosk that accesses the firewood cutting area. **FIREWOOD TAGS MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED. Firewood is not guaranteed. Call the information line (971-940-7388) to check for closures.**
11. **Between April 15 and October 15, carrying a 5-pound BC fire extinguisher and shovel is required by DNR.**
12. No ATVs, UTVs (side-by-sides), e-bikes, motorcycles or snowmobiles are allowed, not even in the back of the vehicle.

Non-Motorized Permit:

1. This permit allows non-motorized access to the Snoqualmie Tree Farm by foot, animal or bicycle. Permit is for the personal use of an individual or single family and is non-transferable. Single family means permit holder and his/her immediate family (i.e., a legally recognized spouse and children **under age 18**). **IF PERMIT HOLDER ALLOWS ANY OTHER PERSON TO ENTER THE PROPERTY, THIS PERMIT SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY REVOKED.** This permit is strictly for recreation access. No research or commercial activities are allowed.
2. Permit must be in the possession of the permit holder. If spouse joining, they will need their copy from MOA account (<https://myoutdooragent.com>). Proof of permit purchase on a cell phone is acceptable. Permit holder will show permit and photo identification to any law enforcement officer and/or any representative of Campbell Global as requested. Permit will not be replaced for any reason. If parking near the property, please leave an additional copy of permit on dash for security purposes.
3. Permit holder may not ride in any motorized vehicle while on Snoqualmie Tree Farm while accessing property with a Non-motorized Recreation Access permit. Failure to abide by this rule will result in loss of Non-motorized Recreation Access permit and driver of vehicle to lose Motorized Vehicle Recreation Access permit.
4. Permit holder may not build new trails or enhance existing trails without written permission from Campbell Global.
5. No firewood cutting.
6. Forest Management traffic such as log trucks, rock trucks, service trucks and crew vehicles have right-of-way, you must yield. Bikes, horses, or pedestrians may not block or impede traffic at gates or on roadways.
7. **No motorized assistance of any kind is allowed. This includes battery powered or assisted e-bikes.**
